

Tu es de quelle nationalité?



Objective

- To consolidate pupils' knowledge of French words for nationalities.
- To be able to ask questions and give 8 different answers.
- To reinforce pupils' understanding of the difference between masculine and feminine.



Equipment

- Enrich School Orienteering Map
- Orienteering Control Markers
- Activity Sheets



Preparation

- Pupils should have been previously introduced to the French vocabulary for the nationalities and relevant questions and answers.
- Pupils could do this activity in pairs or small groups.
- Provide each pair/group with an orienteering map and Activity Sheet.



Instructions

- Pupils use their Enrich School Orienteering Map to locate a series of control points.
- At each control point, they look for the letter on the control marker that is specified on their Activity Sheet and tick the nationality word that has this letter at the end (choice of two).
- They then translate the phrase into English.
- They tick to show if the phrase is either masculine or feminine.
- In pairs they practice asking the question 'Tu es de quelle nationalité?' and answer with that phrase before moving on.



Other information

This could be used for KS2 or 3, depending on their starting point of reading the language.

Vocabulary

4. italien/italienne (Italian)
5. anglais/anglaise (English)
6. français/française (French)

10. irlandais/irlandaise (Irish)
