

Orienteering Challenge

Improper Fractions



Objective

To secure knowledge of improper fractions.



Equipment

- Orienteering Control Markers
- Enrich School Orienteering Map
- Activity Sheet
- Answer Sheet



Preparation

- Children could do this activity in pairs or small groups.
- Print an Activity Sheet and an Enrich School Orienteering Map for each pair/group.
- Explain how to complete the Activity Sheet to the children.



Instructions

- The Activity Sheet has a series of improper fractions, each of which has three possible equivalents of a whole number, followed by a fraction.
- Each improper fraction is linked to a specific control point.
- Children select an equivalent from a set of three for each improper fraction.
- They can then check to see if they were correct by locating the control point linked to the question, using their Enrich School Orienteering Map.
- The 2nd letter on the control marker is next to the correct decimal equivalent.



Other information

- Children can check each answer as they complete them.
- Alternatively, they can select all their answers and then check them all.
